Essay Specifications

- Length: Essays are to be 2500-4500 words in length.
- Footnotes/Endnotes: all are to be formatted as endnotes.
- File type: Essays are to be submitted electronically as either a MS Word document (.doc) or a Rich Text Format document (.rtf).
- References - use APA, MLA or Chicago Manual of Style - be consistent throughout essay.
- Essay must be submitted "Publication Ready." The author is expected to submit the essay as if it were ready for publication, thus maximizing efficiency and ensuring the correct transcription of the author's meaning and intent. Prior to acceptance, the essay must be deemed by the publisher to be "publication ready." This includes a review of the grammar, punctuation, citations, bibliographic references, and any relating components of the essay.
- Authors must submit a Curriculum Vitae (CV)
